Helly Hansen invented the 3-Layer System of Dress of extreme weather clothing. In 1878 the company won a diploma for excellence at the Paris Expo, and began exporting its products. Helly's famous LIFA thermal wear resulted from the 1963 Nobel prize-winning fibre development, while their revolutionary Fibrepile, launched in 1979, to be both snowproof and water repellent, was the mainstay in the development of adventure pursuits in Europe. Helly Hansen ocean waterproofs have featured on television (Deadliest Catch) and in movies (The Perfect Storm), and its protective workwear has always been the gold standard on remote mining sites and dangerous oil-rigs. Today, Helly Hansen has a strong international following in both the sailing and snowsports communities, while its apparel and footwear meets modern lifestyle and activity needs.
